b. Health, Sanitation, and Conservation Committee

Mr. Reinhard asked Mr. Neely for an update on the Compost Agreement between the Borough of Emmaus, Lower Macungie Township, and Lehigh County concerning Lehigh County's transfer of composting equipment to Emmaus and Lower Macungie. Mr. Neely reported that Council previously approved the draft form of the Agreement and that the Lower Macungie Commissioners will meet this week to vote on it, followed by the Lehigh County Commissioners later this month.

Mr. Reinhard reported that at the last Council Meeting during a Personal Appeal, Mr. Slozer asked how to properly recycle household hazardous waste and batteries. Mr. Reinhard provided information from Recycling Services, Inc. located in Pottstown, PA. He suggested visiting its website at www.recyclingservices.org for a list of services that they provide. He also stated that the website provides a link to providers that will recycle household batteries. Home Depot, across the street from Haldeman, Lincoln, Ford, and Advanced Auto Parts are two listed locations.

Mr. Reinhard reported that he is working with Raritan Valley to meet with their representatives on August 11, 2011 to discuss automated refuse pick up.
